This year's quiz was in part inspired by Q92's Wordle – the daily online word game based around 5-letter words. Wordle itself is of course six letters and we worked from there! With that theme in mind you start to see the world differently – mentally counting the letters in the common objects and places around you, an affliction which I'm sure many of you trying to answer the questions also succumbed to?

Usually one or two questions catch out lots of people – and often not the questions we expect. The biggest catch this year turned out to be the Q64's Googol, the huge number which, if written down in full would be 1 followed by 100 zeroes – we couldn't accept the name of the search engine it inspired.

Surprisingly a lot of people – including locals - struggled with Q33's Stilton Cheese Rolling, an event which disappeared for a few years but returned in May 2024 and will hopefully continue for many years to come. We couldn't accept Coopers Cheese Rolling which came up a few times (presumably a reference to Cooper's Hill, but we couldn't find any good references to it by the shorter name).

It was good to see lots of people get Q34's "Nyces," possibly with some help from Q64! We spoke to Nathan Murdoch shortly after the quiz closing deadline and several people had mentioned his inclusion to him, which was nice. If you're local you'll probably recognise lots of his work, such as this mural at the end of Cowgate.

Another local reference was Q80's Antony Gormley rooftop statues around the city centre – hopefully not too hard to find out about if you're one of our many supporters from further afield.

My personal favourite had "more than seven letters" - our answer

for Q82 was Postman although we also got variations on that theme which we also accepted. Of the literary references, Q42's reference to Douglas Adams's *Hitchhiker's Guide to the Galaxy* (salted peanuts being an apt towel accompaniment when travelling through hyperspace) is probably more my level than the others, although Q81's Mister Tickle comes a close second!

Quiz sheet sales were down a little this year and that was reflected in the lower number returned for marking, but that still exceeded 500, and we owe a huge thank you to everyone who did help sell quiz sheets for us, as well – of course – to everyone who parted with hard earned cash to buy one. We've lost some of the venues who sold quiz sheets for us (for example Friends of Peterborough Hospital whose gift shop in the entrance foyer of Peterborough City Hospital has now closed), so if you have venues to suggest – especially if you're a decision maker there – please get in touch. Many other charities and community groups (across the country) sell them on a 50:50 basis to assist with their own fundraising efforts, so if you have a cause in mind, you know where to find us!

2025's quiz is in the early planning stages and will be available to buy, as usual, from 1st September. The quiz remains an incredibly important fundraiser for us and we hope an enjoyable pastime for our supporters – all feedback, good or bad, is gratefully received. By the time you read this pre-orders for 2025 will be available on our website, along with past issues if you missed any.

As a voluntary organisation, more members means more good work in our community, so if you have some spare time looking for a good home let us know. In the meantime following us on social media (Facebook, Instagram) and liking/sharing/following our content helps us reach more people and keeps you up to date with how we're using the funds we raise.
